Vision

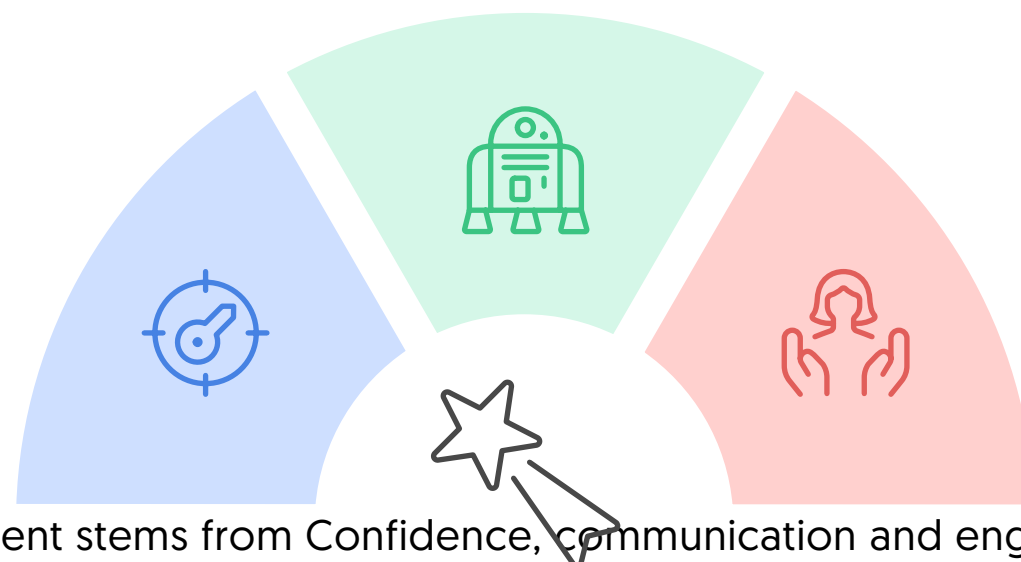
Encourages forward-thinking and strategic planning for future impact.

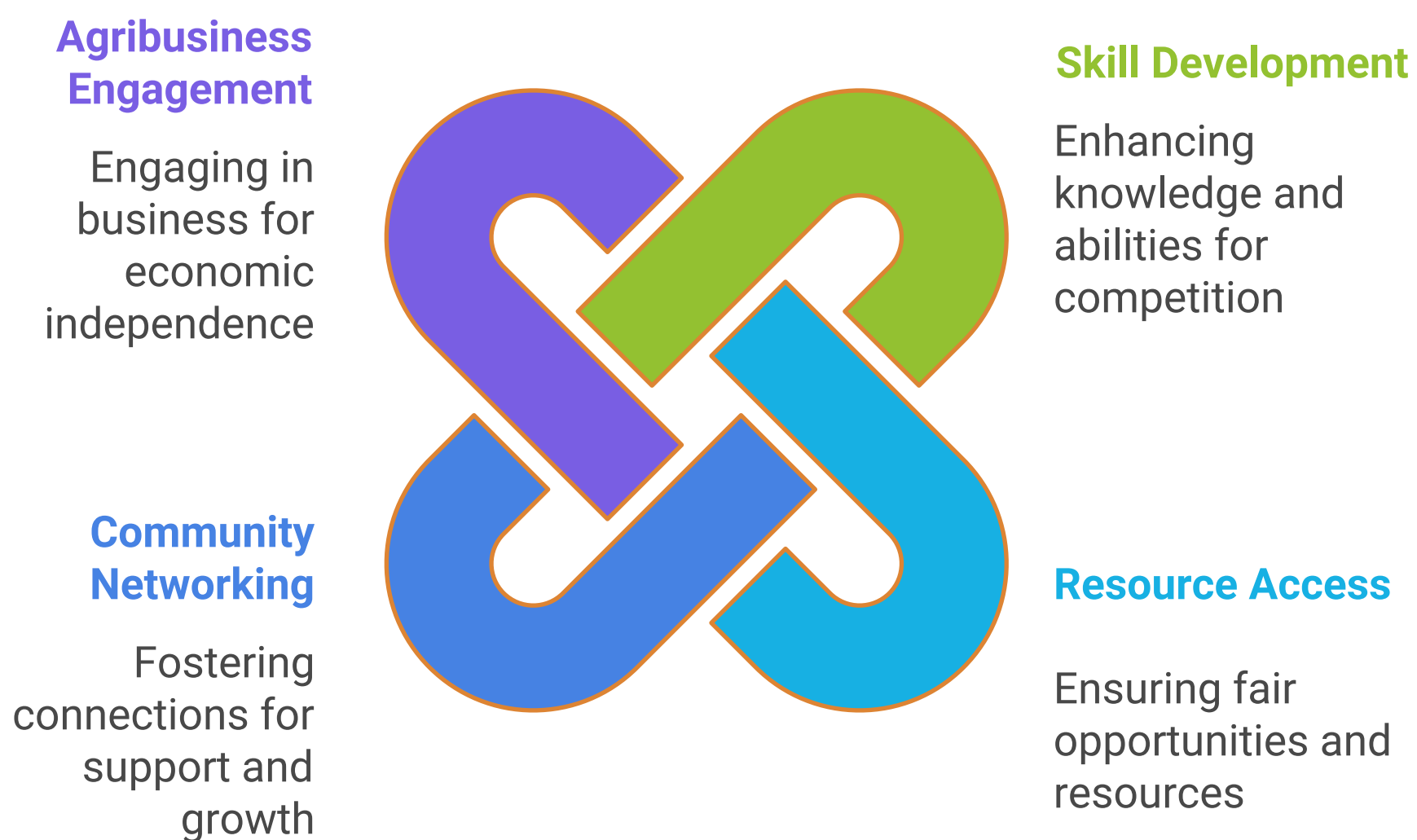
Meaningful Engagement

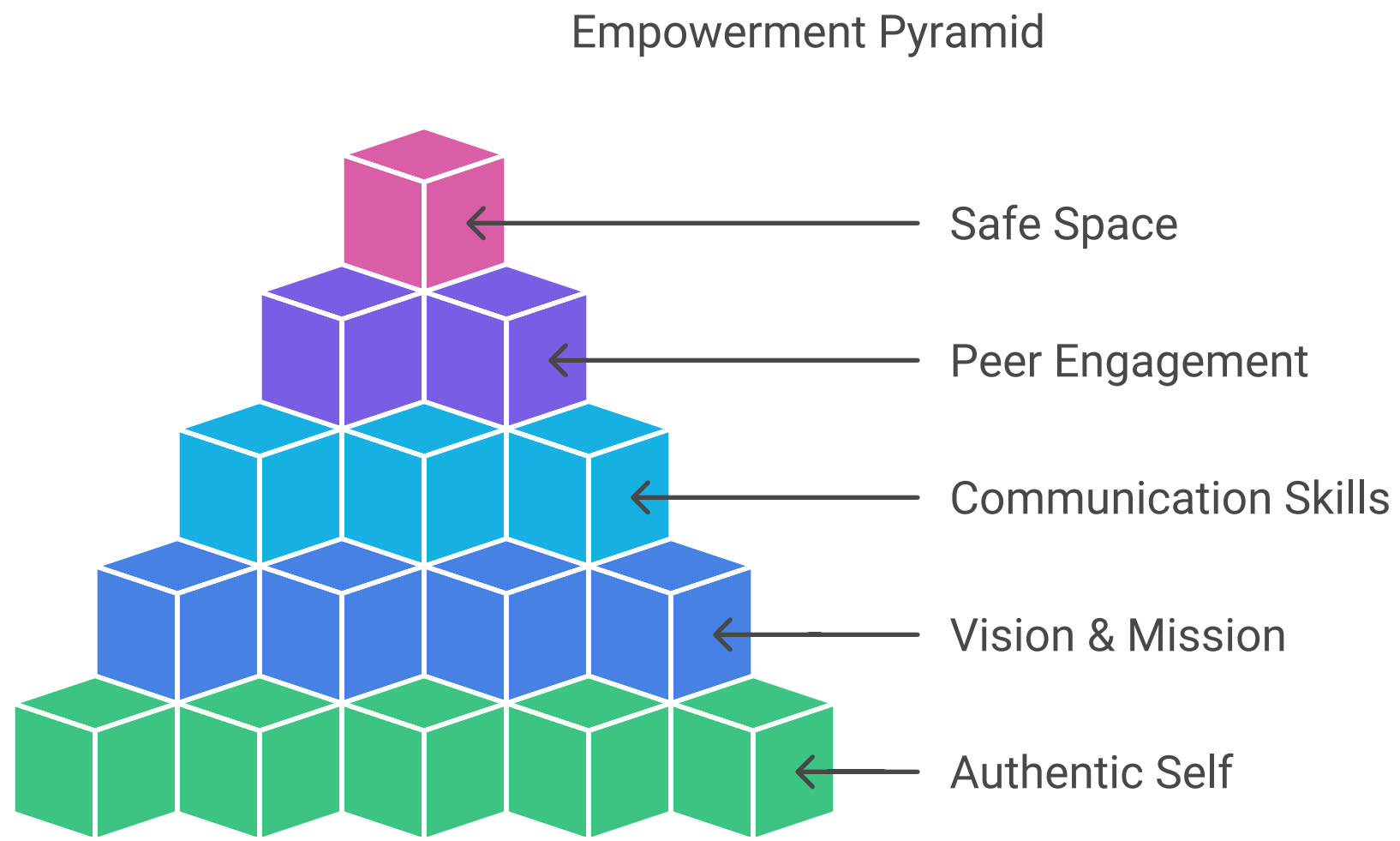

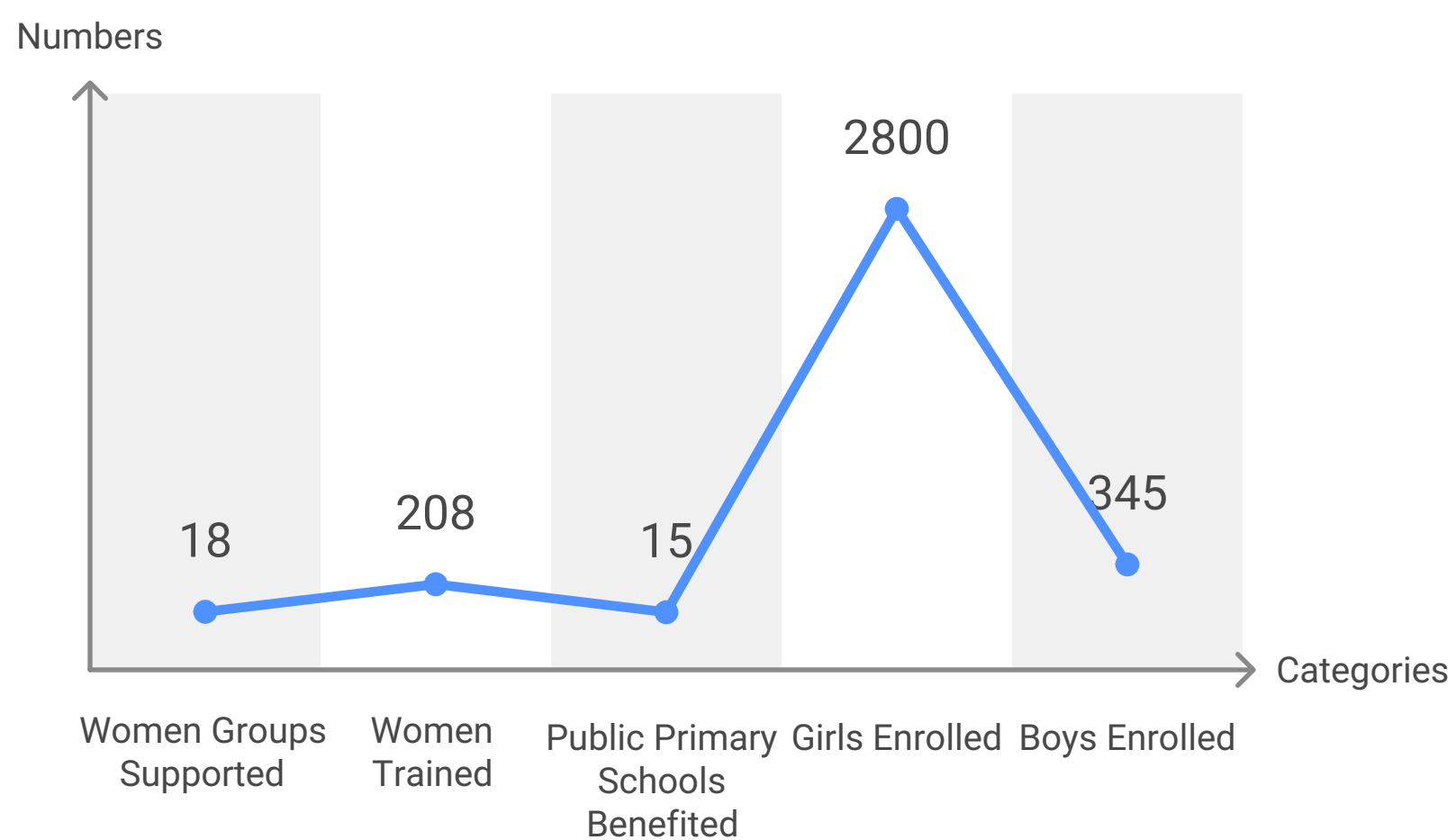

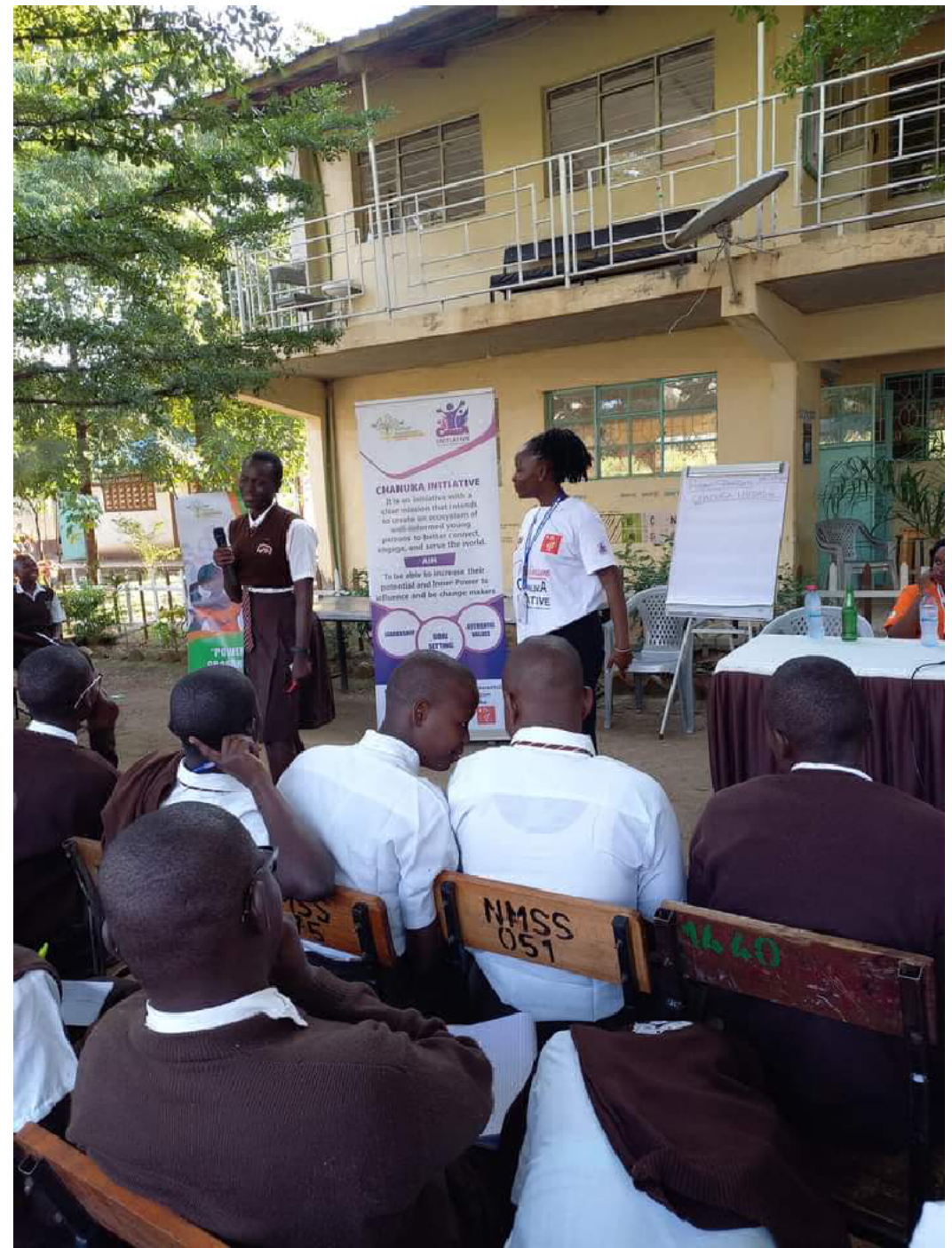
18 women groups have been supported through leadership training and organising with a reach of 208 women who have been trained

15 public primary schools have benefited from this initiative and are at various mentorship levels. a total 2800 girls have been enrolled and 345 boys in the program.
